COURSES

Courses are composed of Online Coursework, Instructor-Led Online sessions, and Lab Hours.

Online Coursework: Instructor-Led Virtual Classroom

A total of 3 lessons are delivered online in an interactive training format which are Instructor Led sessions. These Instructor-Led sessions are scheduled 1.5 hours over a period of twelve weeks. Included within these sessions are live demonstrations which students will apply practical applications of the processes and techniques demonstrated during the assigned lab hours. Online Coursework: On Demand
